Jesus and His brothers.

- ❖ Jesus had brothers (James, Jude, Simon, and Joses) therefore Mary was not a perpetual virgin (Mt. 12:46, 13:55, 27:56; Mk. 3:31, 6:3; John 2:12, Acts 1:14, Gal. 1:19).
- ❖ Two of Jesus brothers are new testament authors: James and Jude.
- ❖ His brothers did not yet believe He was the Christ.
- ❖ The testimony of Jesus was that the deeds of the world were evil.

Jesus sneaks into town.

- ❖ Jesus secretly went to Jerusalem not wanting to draw attention to Himself.
- ❖ Some thought Jesus was a good man, and others thought He was leading people astray.
- ❖ The people feared the Jews, so they did not speak openly about Jesus.

Jesus teaches.

- ❖ Two tests of Godly teaching:
 1. Is the listener willing to do Gods will?
 2. Is the teacher seeking to glorify God?
- ❖ They sought to kill Jesus because He broke the sabbath and claimed to be equal with God. (see John 5:18).
- ❖ Righteous judgement is not based on outward appearance.
